Chandag Junior School received a Sports Premium Grant (SPG) for the financial year 2015-2016, and in line with government policy the premium has been used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of our primary-aged pupils, in the 2014 to 2015 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

- The premium will fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of our primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles, and to ensure the delivery of high quality PE by employing a specialist PE teacher to work alongside teachers, resulting in stronger teaching and learning across the school
- We recognise that the development of healthy, active lifestyles for the long term future as well as a direct positive impact on children's academic progress, their capacity to act and interact socially in an appropriate way, and raise the likelihood of improved regular and punctual attendance throughout their time at school
- We ensure that active teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of our pupils.
- To continue to be part of the School Sport partnership ensuring support with professional development for staff, and sporting opportunities through competitions for the children. In addition, the School Sport partnership has pathways for development with gifted and talented children and sports leadership training.

The range of provision the school may consider over time includes, but is not limited to:

- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided by teachers employed by the school, or other trained teaching professionals
- In-school curriculum continuing professional development & targeted development to increase skills and knowledge of physical education and healthy lifestyles
- Inter-school competitions
