- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided by teachers employed by the school, or other trained teaching professionals
- In-school curriculum continuing professional development & targeted development to increase skills and knowledge of physical education and healthy lifestyles
- Inter-school competitions

Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 81% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the age-related national expectation for attainment in reading. • 67% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the national expectation for progress in reading.
Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 56% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the age-related national expectation for attainment in writing. • 48% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the national expectation for progress in writing.
Mathematics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 67% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the age-related national expectation for attainment in mathematics. • 46% of children in KS2 achieved or exceeded the national expectation for progress in mathematics.
